Introduction to the Bible – In this course, students will cover how we got the bible. At the end of the course, students will know confidently that the Bible is the unmatched source for salvation and moral correctness.

Introduction to Church History – In this course, students will receive an overview of church history from Calvary to modernity. At the end of the course, students will understand the history of the church post resurrection of Christ.

Theology of the Old Testament – In this course, students will cover every book of the Old Testament and discover how the OT points to Christ. At the end of this course, students will have an Associates level knowledge of OT Theology.

Theology of the New Testament – In this course, students will cover every book of the New Testament, discovering the works of Salvation and principles that govern the church and world alike. At the end of this course, students will have an Associates level knowledge of NT Theology.

BACHELORS

The Science of Hermeneutics – In this course, students will learn how to rightly divide the word of truth. At the end of this course, students will learn among other things, the laws of biblical interpretation and how to apply them to scripture.

The Art of Homiletics – In this course, students will learn the mechanics of preparing a sermon. At the end of this course, students will know how to prepare and present a gospel sermon for clarity and effectiveness.

How to Hear the Voice of God – In this course, students will learn the various methods and modes necessary to discern the voice of God. At the end of this course, students will be able to effectively hear from God and identify His voice from all others.

Survey of the Old Testament – In this course, students will survey the Old Testament and discover how the OT points to Christ. At the end of this course, students will have a Bachelors level knowledge of OT Theology.

Survey of the New Testament – In this course, students will survey the New Testament, further enhancing their knowledge of the works of Salvation and principles that govern the church and world alike. At the end of this course, students will have a Bachelors level knowledge of NT Theology.

MASTERS

Survey of Biblical Doctrine – In this course, students will examine various biblical doctrines such as the doctrine of God and the doctrine of salvation. At the end of this course, students will be able understand and apply the doctrines contained within the word of God.

Survey of the Old Testament – In this course, students will survey the Old Testament and discover how the OT points to Christ. At the end of this course, students will have a Masters level knowledge of OT Theology.

Between the Testaments – In this course, students will cover the 400 years between the books of Malachi and Matthew. At the end of this course, students will understand how God's silence during the Maccabean period pointed directly to Jesus.

Survey of the New Testament – In this course, students will survey the New Testament, further enhancing their knowledge of the works of Salvation and principles

that govern the church and world alike. At the end of this course, students will have a Masters level knowledge of NT Theology.

Christian Apologetics – In this course, students will examine the principles that govern Christian Apologetics, and why it is necessary to defend the message of the cross. At the end of this course, students will be able to effectively defend the faith.

World Religions – In this course, students will examine non-western religions and their impact on Christian thought. At the end of this course, students will be able to defend the message of the cross against the influence of false religions. This course will also teach students how to enhance their biblical worldview.

The Church: The First 500 Years – In this course, students will examine the first 500 years of church history, with an emphasis on the universal church. At the end of this course, students will understand how the church evolved through the first 500 years of its existence.

The Church: The Last 1500 Years – In this course, students will examine the last 1500 years of church history, with an emphasis on the universal church. At the end of this course, students will understand how the church evolved through the last 500 years of its existence; and what impact movements such as the reformation had on the church.

Christian Leadership and Ethics – In this course, students will examine what constitutes leadership and ethics within the context of Christian thought. At the end of this course, students will understand Christian leadership and ethics and how to make decisions based on a correct consciousness and biblical worldview.

Master's Thesis Project – In this course, students will work to produce an original written 15,000-word scholarship paper, based on a predetermined topic, while working under the direction of our professorial staff.
